Teaching Our Children

They have their own rights •They always have the right to say "No." • Remind them an adult never needs help from a child • If an adult is asking a child to help them with something, that is a warning sign • Practice confidence with your kids • Teach them to yell "Stop!" & "Stranger!." • Never walk away with anyone other than a parent or the person who was arranged to take care of them that day • Do not be passive • If thrown into the front seat of a 4-door car, teach your child to jump to the backseat and try the passenger doors • If thrown in a trunk, teach your child not to panic and to look for a panel in the trunk that comes out when you pull on it. Tear the wires to the tail-lights and brakes. Police might pull the abductor over.

For Us As Parents

Never let your child go to the bathroom alone • Be leery of parked cars that linger, as someone may be watching you and your child • Keep photos of your child as current as possible, along with dental and medical records • Establish a secret password between you and your child before they ever open the door • Give your child a GPS tracker to wear under his/her clothing (i.e. Pendant or Necklace, which can be bought on our site) • Do not label your child's lunchboxes, clothing, possession, etc. A kidnapper can use that information to make the child trust them • If you are in a public place scream for help, this will alert others around you and security, and give the abillity to lock exits and look for the abductor.
